Mission Engagement Bloke!

Nehemiah has me reflecting on life in the Uniting Churches throughout our Presbytery. We're into chapter four. (May I suggest you enjoy one, two -scan three, and read carefully with me in chapter four?)

At a time when we have church buildings in need of entire new roofs, foundational repairs, stained glass restoration and new plumbing; millions of dollars of property repairs.... Nehemiah speaks of something much bigger than rebuilding Jerusalem's walls.



The mission of Nehemiah, who risked his life three times a day tasting King Artaxerxes' wine for poison, is nothing less than to regather the people of God into His purpose, in the place of His presence.

When he hears about the enormous building project required, within that much bigger picture, he prays to the 'God of Heaven'. Then, he asks the right questions of the right people, organises a fund raiser.... And prays and fasts some more.

I had tongue in cheek when I said skip through chapter three. What you'll find there is the diverse people of God committed to the big vision; priests, plumbers, gold smiths, garbage collectors, every man and his dog; responsible for their part of the wall with whatever resources they have.

And this is where we find a template for our current circumstances within the community of God's people:

When times are (obviously) tough there is no shortage of Sanballat and Tobiah voices, saying, "Your efforts are feeble. Will you get this done in a day? You're surrounded by rubble and do you think you'll ever worship here again?" (Cont. next page)

 The previously carved out space for our worship and witness is no longer automatically ours, nor necessarily welcome in the wider community.

In response, Nehemiah prays. He doesn't argue or debate. He prays to God.

As a result of *all those people* in chapter three, "who worked with all their heart" the whole wall reached half its height. — The whole wall is rising together. We are a connexional church — how are we supporting the different congregations and faith communities with whom we belong in the community of the Presbytery?

From initial ridicule, the outside voices become threatening in 4:8. Then, "the strength of the labourers is giving out. Our enemies aim to put an end to the work and kill us. Wherever you turn we will be under attack."

It's always easy to blame our circumstances, or someone else.

In response, Nehemiah prays. "But we prayed to our God and posted a guard day and night."

Chapter four brings us to the question of why: Why are we committed to restoring and renewing the physical and metaphorical 'places' where we encounter God in worship and bear witness to God's presence?

The answer is not about our needing to feel comfortable, or at home with what we had back in the good old days. In fact, Nehemiah "stationed some of the people behind the lowest points of the wall, at the exposed places in family groups." — are we called, together, to genuine risk? Restoration and renewal of our movement is worth the struggle for the "sake of your brothers, your sons, your, your daughters your wives and your homes."

That mission isn't someone else's. It's for all of us; "nobles, officials, priests and the rest of the people."

Nehemiah prayed – "Remember the Lord, who is great and awesome."

If prayer has been the central thread of this passionate communal challenge, chapter four concludes with a sharp reminder of our need to stick together. Nehemiah keeps the bugler close by, saying, "This hard work is extensive and spread out, and we are widely separated from one another along the wall. Whenever you hear the sound of the trumpet, join us here."

Our God will fight for us.



Based in Darwin, Nungalinya College is the premier combined Churches Registered Training Organisation for Indigenous Australians. Every year around 300 adult Indigenous Christians study at Nungalinya.

They come from Anglican, Uniting, Catholic, Lutheran, Baptist and other backgrounds. On average, students come into Darwin from 80-90 discrete, remote Indigenous communities, and a few from urban centres.

Our training programs explore the Christian faith contextually through courses in Literacy & Numeracy, Ministry & Theology, Chaplaincy, Art, Family Wellbeing and Bible Translation.





the same dates as the Hervey Bay Uniting Church Market Days.





Rev. Dr Kolimon will share a video sermon and Rev. Dr Apwee Ting has written a liturgy focusing on our partners in South East Asia.




