

Graham's Reflection

Greetings Presbytery,

Wow, it's February already and congregations across the Presbytery are quickly gearing up for the year ahead. Our Presbytery leadership met for our annual strategic planning days on the 28th and 29th of January, and 2025 looks to be an exciting but busy 12 months. As we recommence our various ministries and mission following the Christmas/New Year break and look at



new opportunities and possibilities, I'd encourage us all to stop for a moment first and reflect on our motivations.

Epiphany is a time in the church year when many of our Lectionary readings lead us to consider our motivations by examining the call placed upon people like John the Baptist, the disciples, and of course most importantly, Jesus as they each start out in roles that will ultimately fulfill purposes ordained by God. For the disciples, many of them lowly fishermen, God's purposes were very different to their own sense of purpose.

I find myself challenged by this at the start of each year and turn regularly to the words of Paul to the church at Corinth.

"Consider your own call, brothers and sisters: not many of you were wise by human standards, not many were powerful, not many were of noble birth." (1 Corinthians 1:26)

Why do we do the things we do? Why do we take on Christian ministry in one of its many forms - lay or ordained? Why do we join councils of the church? Why do we run missional projects such as Op Shops or Breakfast Ministries?

Why do we put so much time, effort and money into buildings and structures? Why do we feel led to run a playgroup? What is our purpose in planning a children's ministry or get involved in Aged Care visitation? Why, why, why?

If it is for personal or self-centred reasons, it is not a calling because the motivation is achieving personal (or corporate) goals, not the vision and purpose of God. And perhaps that is why some things just don't seem to make a difference, regardless of the effort we put in.

God does not want us to act out of obligation, habit, ritual, selfishness or self-importance – our actions should be a heart-felt response to God's love for us. In other words, our actions or works should be external evidence of what is happening internally in our relationship with God. This is perhaps the key to understanding whether something we feel led to perform is a 'calling'. We need to recognise why we take on the task.

As an exercise to help us to 'consider our call' here is a quick test. Consider a task you are doing, either personally or as a church, congregation or committee. Then reflect on these comments:

If you are doing it <u>only</u> because no one else will, it's a job. If you're doing it to serve the Lord, it's a calling.

If you're doing it just well enough to get by, it's a job. If you're doing it to the best of your ability, it's a calling.

If you'll do it only so long as it doesn't interfere with other activities, it's a job. If you're committed to staying with it even when it means letting go of other things, it's a calling.

If you quit because no one praised you or thanked you, it was a job. If you stay with it even though no one seems to notice, it's a calling.

It's hard to get excited about a job. It's almost impossible not to get excited about a calling.

If your concern is success, it's a job. If your concern is faithfulness, it's a calling.

People may say "well done" when you do your job. The Lord will say "well done" when you fulfil your calling.

An average church is filled with people doing jobs. A great church is filled with people who answer God's call by doing what is right, loving mercy, and walking humbly with their God (Micah 6:6-8).

How did you go? What is motivating you in your church life this year?

Timothy tells us, "He has saved us and called us to a holy life—not because of anything we have done but because of his own purpose and grace. This grace was given us in Christ Jesus before the beginning of time. (2 Timothy 1:9)

Our true calling is not found in seeking a purpose, but living a life that is Holy in response to God's mercy, purpose and grace.


